

## Data Dictionary

Item	Description
<b>EA Number</b>	The particular EA number of the project. It is the primary state identifier for transportation projects financed with federal and/or state funds.
<b>District</b>	The Caltrans zone that the project is being/was worked in.
<b>Year Completion</b>	Date the construction of project was completed.
<b>County</b>	Acronym of the county located in the respective Caltrans District of the project.
<b>Route</b>	The highway and/or freeway route number that the project is being worked on.
<b>Dir</b>	Direction that the lanes are facing on a route for the project.
<b>xBegPM</b>	The combination of prefix, postmile, and suffix, in that order for the starting postmile of the project.
<b>xEndPM</b>	The combination of prefix, postmile, and suffix, in that order for the ending postmile of the project.
<b>Layer</b>	Position of the layer of the pavement material that is being installed. Ex: 1 = top layer, 99 = milling, etc.
<b>Material Code</b>	Type of pavement treatment.
<b>Thickness (ft.)</b>	The depth of the pavement material being used for the project in ft.
<b>Lane</b>	Road lane the project is working on.
<b>Beg State ODM</b>	Beginning of the project using a State odometer.
<b>End State ODM</b>	Ending of the project using a State odometer.
<b>Total Number of Lanes</b>	Number of lanes the project was performed on.
<b>Total Lane Miles</b>	Number of miles from lanes that the project was worked on.
<b>Treatment</b>	Main pavement treatment of the project/section.
<b>BPP</b>	Beginning post mile prefix is a letter before the post mile that could display that the road was realigned or overlapped.
<b>Beg PM</b>	It is the beginning Post Mile of where the project is starting.
<b>BPS</b>	BPS is the beginning post mile suffix which is when that segment is unrelinquished, supplemental, or newly aligned.
<b>EPP</b>	Ending post mile prefix is a letter before the post mile that could display that the road was realigned or overlapped.
<b>End PM</b>	It is the end Post Mile of where the project is starting.
<b>EPS</b>	EPS is the end post mile suffix which is when that segment is unrelinquished, supplemental, or newly aligned.
<b>Length</b>	Length in lane miles of the pavement section.
<b>digout</b>	If there was a digout in the lane or not. A digout is a localized repair or patch that involves digging out or excavating an area of damaged pavement
<b>Work Code</b>	Treatment code for decision trees.
